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Section I. Instructions to Bidders

A-General

<p>1. Scope of Bid</p>	<p>1.1 In connection with the Invitation for Bids, specified in the Bid Data Sheet (BDS), the Purchaser, as specified in the BDS, issues these Bidding Documents for the supply of Goods and Related Services incidental thereto as specified in Section VII, Schedule of Requirements. Throughout these Bidding Documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the term “in writing” means communicated in written form (e.g. by mail, e-mail, fax, telex) with proof of receipt; (b) if the context so requires, “singular” means “plural” and vice versa; and (c) “day” means calendar day.
<p>2. Source of Funds</p>	<p>2.1 The Borrower or Recipient (hereinafter called “Borrower”) specified in the BDS received financing (hereinafter called “funds”) from State Sponsoring Scheme .The Borrower intends to apply a portion of the funds to eligible payments under the contract for which these Bidding Documents are issued.</p> <p>2.2 Payment by the State Government will be made only at the request of the Borrower and upon approval by the State Government</p>
<p>3. Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices</p>	<p>3.1 The State Government requires compliance with its policy in regard to corrupt and fraudulent practices as set forth in Section VI.</p> <p>3.2 In further pursuance of this policy, Bidders shall permit and shall cause its agents (where declared or not), sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers or suppliers and to permit the State Government to inspect all accounts, records and other documents relating to the submission of the application, bid submission (in case prequalified), and contract performance (in the case of award), and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the State Government</p>
<p>4. Eligible Bidders</p>	<p>4.1 A Bidder may be a firm that is a private entity, a government-owned entity—subject to ITB 4.5—or any combination of such entities in the form of a joint venture (JV) under an existing agreement or with the intent to enter into such an agreement supported by a letter of intent. In the case of a joint venture, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate a Representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the bidding process and, in the event the JV is awarded the Contract, during contract execution. Unless specified in the BDS, there is no limit on the number of members in a JV.</p> <p>4.2 A Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest. Any Bidder found to have a conflict of interest shall be disqualified. A Bidder may be considered to have a conflict of interest for the purpose of this bidding process, if the Bidder:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by or is under common control with another Bidder; or

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (b) receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy from another Bidder; or (c) has the same legal representative as another Bidder; or (d) has a relationship with another Bidder, directly or through common third parties, that puts it in a position to influence the bid of another Bidder, or influence the decisions of the Purchaser regarding this bidding process; or (e) participates in more than one bid in this bidding process. Participation by a Bidder in more than one Bid will result in the disqualification of all Bids in which such Bidder is involved. However, this does not limit the inclusion of the same subcontractor in more than one bid; or (f) any of its affiliates participated as a consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications of the works that are the subject of the bid; or (g) any of its affiliates has been hired (or is proposed to be hired) by the Purchaser or Borrower for the Contract implementation; or (h) would be providing goods, works, or non-consulting services resulting from or directly related to consulting services for the preparation or implementation of the project specified in the BDS ITB 2.1 that it provided or were provided by any affiliate that directly or indirectly controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with that firm; or (i) has a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Borrower (or of the project implementing agency, or of a recipient of a part of the loan) who: (i) are directly or indirectly involved in the preparation of the bidding documents or specifications of the contract, and/or the bid evaluation process of such contract; or (ii) would be involved in the implementation or supervision of such contract unless the conflict stemming from such relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the State Government throughout the procurement process and execution of the contract <p>4.3 A Bidder may have the nationality of any country, subject to the restrictions pursuant to ITB 4.7. A Bidder shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if the Bidder is constituted, incorporated or registered in and operates in conformity with the provisions of the laws of that country, as evidenced by its articles of incorporation (or equivalent documents of constitution or association) and its registration documents, as the case may be. This criterion also shall apply to the determination of the nationality of proposed sub-contractors or sub-consultants for any part of the Contract including related Services.</p> <p>4.4 A Bidder that has been sanctioned by the State Government in accordance with the above ITB 3.1, including in accordance with the State Government Guidelines on Preventing and Combating Corruption in Projects Financed by IBRD Loans and IDA Credits and Grants (“Anti-Corruption Guidelines”), shall be ineligible to be prequalified for, bid for, or be awarded a Bank-financed contract or benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or otherwise, during such period of time as the Bank</p>
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	<p>shall have determined. The list of debarred firms and individuals is available at the electronic address specified in the BDS.</p> <p>4.5 Bidders that are Government-owned enterprises or institutions in the Purchaser’s Country may participate only if they can establish that they (i) are legally and financially autonomous (ii) operate under commercial law, and (iii) are not dependent agencies of the Purchaser. To be eligible, a government-owned enterprise or institution shall establish to the Bank’s satisfaction, through all relevant documents, including its Charter and other information the Bank may request, that it: (i) is a legal entity separate from the government (ii) does not currently receive substantial subsidies or budget support; (iii) operates like any commercial enterprise, and, inter alia, is not obliged to pass on its surplus to the government, can acquire rights and liabilities, borrow funds and be liable for repayment of its debts, and can be declared bankrupt; and (iv) is not bidding for a contract to be awarded by the department or agency of the government which under their applicable laws or regulations is the reporting or supervisory authority of the enterprise or has the ability to exercise influence or control over the enterprise or institution.</p> <p>4.6 A Bidder shall not be under suspension from bidding by the Purchaser as the result of the operation of a Bid–Securing Declaration.</p> <p>4.7 Firms and individuals may be ineligible if so indicated in Section V and (a) as a matter of law or official regulations, the Borrower’s country prohibits commercial relations with that country, provided that the Bank is satisfied that such exclusion does not preclude effective competition for the supply of goods or the contracting of works or services required; or (b) by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Borrower’s country prohibits any import of goods or contracting of works or services from that country, or any payments to any country, person, or entity in that country.</p> <p>4.8 A Bidder shall provide such evidence of eligibility satisfactory to the Purchaser, as the Purchaser shall reasonably request.</p>
<p>5. Eligible Goods and Related Services</p>	<p>5.1 All the Goods and Related Services to be supplied under the Contract and financed by the Bank may have their origin in any country in accordance with Section V, Eligible Countries.</p> <p>5.2 For purposes of this Clause, the term “goods” includes commodities, raw material, machinery, equipment, and industrial plants; and “related services” includes services such as insurance, installation, training, and initial maintenance.</p> <p>5.3 The term “origin” means the country where the goods have been mined, grown, cultivated, produced, manufactured or processed; or, through manufacture, processing, or assembly, another commercially recognized article results that differs substantially in its basic characteristics from its components.</p>

	<p>6.2 The Invitation for Bids issued by the Purchaser is not part of the Bidding Document.</p> <p>6.3 Unless obtained directly from the Purchaser, the Purchaser is not responsible for the completeness of the document, responses to requests for clarification, the Minutes of the pre-Bid meeting (if any), or Addenda to the Bidding Document in accordance with ITB 8. In case of any contradiction, documents obtained directly from the Purchaser shall prevail.</p> <p>6.4 The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the Bidding Documents and to furnish with its Bid all information or documentation as is required by the Bidding Documents.</p>
<p>7. Clarification of Bidding Documents</p>	<p>7.1 A Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Document shall contact the Purchaser in writing at the Purchaser's address specified in the BDS. The Purchaser will respond in writing to any request for clarification, provided that such request is received prior to the deadline for submission of bids within a period specified in the BDS. The Purchaser shall forward copies of its response to all Bidders who have acquired the Bidding Documents in accordance with ITB 6.3, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. 10. Language of Bid	10.1 The Bid, as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the bid exchanged by the Bidder and the Purchaser, shall be written in the language specified in the BDS. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Bid may be in another language provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages into the language specified in the BDS, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Bid, such translation shall govern.
11. 14.Bid Prices and Discounts	<p>14.1 The prices and discounts quoted by the Bidder in the Letter of Bid and in the Price Schedules shall conform to the requirements specified below.</p> <p>14.2 All lots (contracts) and items must be listed and priced separately in the Price Schedules.</p> <p>14.3 The price to be quoted in the Letter of Bid in accordance with ITB 12.1 shall be the total price of the bid, excluding any discounts offered.</p> <p>14.4 The Bidder shall quote any discounts and indicate the methodology for their application in the Letter of Bid, in accordance with ITB 12.1.</p> <p>14.5 Prices quoted by the Bidder shall be fixed during the Bidder's performance of the Contract and not subject to variation on any account, unless otherwise specified in the BDS. A bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation shall be treated as non responsive and shall be rejected, pursuant to ITB 29. 14.7 The terms EXW, CIP, and other similar terms shall be governed by the rules prescribed in the current edition of Incoterms, published by The International Chamber of Commerce, as specified in the BDS.

14.8 Prices shall be quoted as specified in each Price Schedule included in Section IV, Bidding Forms. The dis-aggregation of price components is required solely for the purpose of facilitating the comparison of bids by the Purchaser. This shall not in any way limit the Purchaser's right to contract on any of the terms offered. In quoting prices, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country, in accordance with Section V, Eligible Countries. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible country in accordance with Section V, Eligible Countries. Prices shall be entered in the following manner:

In the amount and currency specified in the BDS.</p> <p>19.2. A Bid Securing Declaration shall use the form included in Section IV, Bidding Forms.</p> <p>19.3. Policy - Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices

“Fraud and Corruption:

1.16 It is the State Governments policy to require that Borrowers bidders, suppliers, contractors and their agents (whether declared or not), sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers or suppliers, and any personnel thereof, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of Bank-financed contracts.² In pursuance of this policy, the State Government :

- (a) defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) “corrupt practice” is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;³;

 - (iii) “collusive practice” is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party;⁵
 - (iv) “coercive practice” is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;⁶
 - (v) "obstructive practice" is:
 - (aa) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Bank investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation, or
 - (bb) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank’s inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 1.16(e) below.
- (b) will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the bidder recommended for award, or any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- (c) will declare mis-procurement and cancel the portion of the loan allocated to a contract if it determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement or the implementation of the contract in question, without the Borrower

² In this context, any action to influence the procurement process or contract execution for undue advantage is improper.

³ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “another party” refers to a public official acting in relation to the procurement process or contract execution. In this context, “public official” includes World Bank staff and employees of other organizations taking or reviewing procurement decisions.

⁴ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “party” refers to a public official; the terms “benefit” and “obligation” relate to the procurement process or contract execution; and the “act or omission” is intended to influence the procurement process or contract execution.

⁵ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “parties” refers to participants in the procurement process (including public officials) attempting either themselves, or through another person or entity not participating in the procurement or selection process, to simulate competition or to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels, or are privy to each other’s bid prices or other conditions.

⁶ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “party” refers to a participant in the procurement process or contract execution.

having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;

- (d) will sanction a firm or individual, at any time, in accordance with the prevailing Bank's sanctions procedures,⁷ including by publicly declaring such firm or individual ineligible, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time: (i) to be awarded a Bank-financed contract; and (ii) to be a nominated⁸;
- (e) will require that a clause be included in bidding documents and in contracts financed by a Bank loan, requiring bidders, suppliers and contractors, and their sub-contractors, agents, personnel, consultants, service providers, or suppliers, to permit the Bank to inspect all accounts, records, and other documents relating to the submission of bids and contract performance, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.”

⁷ A firm or individual may be declared ineligible to be awarded a Bank financed contract upon: (i) completion of the Bank's sanctions proceedings as per its sanctions procedures, including, inter alia, cross-debarment as agreed with other International Financial Institutions, including Multilateral Development Banks, and through the application the World Bank Group corporate administrative procurement sanctions procedures for fraud and corruption; and (ii) as a result of temporary suspension or early temporary suspension in connection with an ongoing sanctions proceeding. 2. Technical Specifications

1. The nurseryman should have 'Phyto-sanitary Certificate' and 'certificate of Origin' issued by the concerned competent authority at the time of supply of the planting material and the above document should be in English Language .
2. The calliper of Rootstocks should be 9-12mm thickness and grafted plants should have thickness of between 16 to19 mm.
3. The plants should be free from soil.
4. The varietal Character of the fruit plants to be supplied should conform to the established variety as mentioned in the catalogue.
5. The nurseryman should have complete record of progeny trees i.e. the source of scion wood
6. The bud wood should have been taken from the regularly good performing productive mother trees.
7. The rootstock and scion wood should be free from all known viruses , diseases and pests.
8. The scion wood should be from known pedigree trees of established variety.
9. The nursery plants should have good rooting system conforming to the rootstock used.
10. The plants should not have any sign of cracks/wound or any winter injury.

➤ Shipment Conditions

11. The supplier shall at all times indemnify the purchaser, free of cost, against all third-party claims of infringement of patent rights for the plant material which is protected in the country of origin; arising from use of the said material or any part thereof in India.
12. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to the final destination. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling and exposure to extreme temperatures, humid weather and precipitation during transit and open storage. The size and weight of the packing cases shall also be taken into consideration, where ever applicable, the available inland mode (s) of transport in India, the remoteness of final destination and the absence of mechanical handling facilities. Further, limitations and/or mandatory instructions, if any in the weight, volume and size of the packages shall also be taken into consideration.
13. The packing, marking and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements if any, as shall be expressly provided for in the contract as per the subsequent instructions given by the purchaser.
14. **Packing instruction:** Each package will be marked by the supplier at its own expense, on three sides with indelible ink/paint, with the following details:
 - a) Contract No. and date
 - b) Name and address of the consignee
 - c) Name and address of the supplier
 - d) Brief description of goods
 - e) Gross weight and outer dimension of the package
 - f) Country of origin of goods
 - g) Packing list reference, no, and
 - h) Any other requirement, relevant to the contract.
15. **Delivery of goods.** Delivery of goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified by the purchaser at the time of invitation of bids.
16. **Insurance:** The goods supplied under the contract, shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage acquisition transportation, storage and delivery as indicated and the supplier shall arrange and pay for the cargo insurance, naming the purchaser as the beneficiary.

17. The material should be shipped in proper refrigerated containers (that are suitable for shipping plant materials), which should be properly fumigated before loading the containers at the nursery site(s) in Italy. The containers should preferably be 20 feet ones. Such reefers are available and same will be taken to different nursery sites to avoid exposure of plants to higher temperature. In case, the containers of 20 feet size are not available in that event containers up to 40 feet size will be used. The stacking of the plants be done in such a way that there is adequate air circulation on top, bottom and between the stacks/pallets so that proper air temperature is maintained in all parts of the container during the transportation.
18. The temperature of the containers is to be maintained between 1° to 2° centigrade throughout the shipment from nursery up to the final destination so that the plants reach the destination in good condition. Minimum three data loggers (non-digital i.e. easy to handle) are to be placed at different places inside each container (one in the front, one in the middle and one in the end) for keeping proper record of the temperature of the container during shipment and inland transportation.
19. The material has to be transported from Nursery site up to the final destination HPMC Cold Store at Parwanoo / Private cold store at Baddi in H.P. in the same containers. The containers should be loaded at the point of origin i.e. at the nursery site and should not be de-loaded at any place up to the final destination. This implies that transshipment is not at all permitted.
20. Once the container is loaded, its details i.e. Container Number and Cargo details should be communicated along with the Shipping Line whose container has been hired, also outline the name of the port and details of the voyage etc. The shipment should be trackable online by the purchaser at any point of time. The purchaser reserves the right to inspect the material on arrival in the presence of authorized person of the supplier and can take action in case any violation or breach of conditions is detected/noticed.
21. Authorized representative of the supplier should be present at the destination at the time of delivery and only in his/her presence the seals of the reefers/containers shall be opened and verified by the committee constituted for this purpose by the purchaser.
22. The shipment of the material from Nursery be carried out in lots and phases, so as to ensure proper inspection and handling of the material at the final destination
23. The planting material should have ample rooting which is an important factor for sprouting when planted in the field. To ensure maximum survival of plants in the nurseries, the client will ensure optimum growing conditions. However, in case plants do not survive uniformly within one month of plantation, proportionate cost shall be deducted from the 40% payment as per payment schedule.
24. Post Entry Quarantine Authorities will take samples for screening of pathogens on arrival of consignments and get it tested in the labs. In case any disease or pest is detected after screening then supplier will be blacklisted and the cost of virus infested plants will be recovered from the performance security of the bidder.
25. **Warranty** the supplier shall provide comprehensive warranty for a period of one year from the date of final acceptance of the supplies in good conditions & as per the technical specifications.
26. Client in its sole exclusive discretion may reject any or all the responses with or without assigning reasons and can withdraw this offer at any time before or after the submission of bids.
The goods supplied under this contract shall conform to the standards mentioned in the 'Technical Specifications' authoritative standards as applicable to the 'goods' in the country of origin.
27. The shortlisted nurseryman will ensure to depute his representative authorised by him to supervise plantation of planting material at the plantation site, who has adequate

knowledge and experience of undertaking such works in order to ensure maximum survival of planting material.

3. Inspections and Tests

Pre dispatch inspections and tests shall be performed as under:

1. Pre-dispatch physical verification of the nurseries and planting material to be supplied by the Nurseryman to ascertain that the planting material is coming from original source.
2. Inspection of the planting material in the premises of the supplier to ascertain that the planting material is healthy (free from pests and diseases) and meets the technical specifications provided in the bidding document.

APPENDIX TO GENERAL CONDITIONS

Policy- Corrupt and Fraudulent Practices

“Fraud and Corruption:

1.16 It is the State Government policy to require that Borrowers (including beneficiaries of (text in this Appendix shall not be modified) loans), bidders, suppliers, contractors and their agents (whether declared or not), sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers or suppliers, and any personnel thereof, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of Bank-financed contracts.⁹ In pursuance of this policy, the Bank:

- (a) defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - (i) “corrupt practice” is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;¹⁰
 - (ii) “fraudulent practice” is any act or omission, including a misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain a financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation;¹¹
 - (iii) “collusive practice” is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party;¹²
 - (iv) “coercive practice” is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;¹³
 - (v) "obstructive practice" is:
 - (aa) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Bank investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation, or

⁹ In this context, any action to influence the procurement process or contract execution for undue advantage is improper.

¹⁰ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “*another party*” refers to a public official acting in relation to the procurement process or contract execution. In this context, “*public official*” includes World Bank staff and employees of other organizations taking or reviewing procurement decisions.

¹¹ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “*party*” refers to a public official; the terms “*benefit*” and “*obligation*” relate to the procurement process or contract execution; and the “*act or omission*” is intended to influence the procurement process or contract execution.

¹² For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “*parties*” refers to participants in the procurement process (including public officials) attempting either themselves, or through another person or entity not participating in the procurement or selection process, to simulate competition or to establish bid prices at artificial, non-competitive levels, or are privy to each other’s bid prices or other conditions.

¹³ For the purpose of this sub-paragraph, “*party*” refers to a participant in the procurement process or contract execution.

- (bb) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 1.16(e) below.
- (b) will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the bidder recommended for award, or any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- (c) will declare mis-procurement and cancel the portion of the loan allocated to a contract if it determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement or the implementation of the contract in question, without the Borrower having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;
